### Marker Loads

Bright Spots were used in the automobile industry to do braking test. An instrument was attached to the car's braking system that worked on a pendulum. When the brakes were applied the system swung forward and fired a yellow or green caulk straight down onto the pavement marking where the brakes were applied. The distance could then be measured from the chalk spot to the final stopped place on the vehicle. The AAA was instrumental in distributing them to places like high school driving classes to illustrate how far a vehicle travels until completely stopped and driver's reaction time. Traditionally they were Long or Long Rifle primed cases filled with a colored caulk substance with a white over-wad. Several headstamps have been noted such as the Western diamond, Remington, none, etc. so it is assumed that they loaded whatever they could purchase. D.W. Pontious of Columbus, Ohio seems to be the primary distributor and loader.

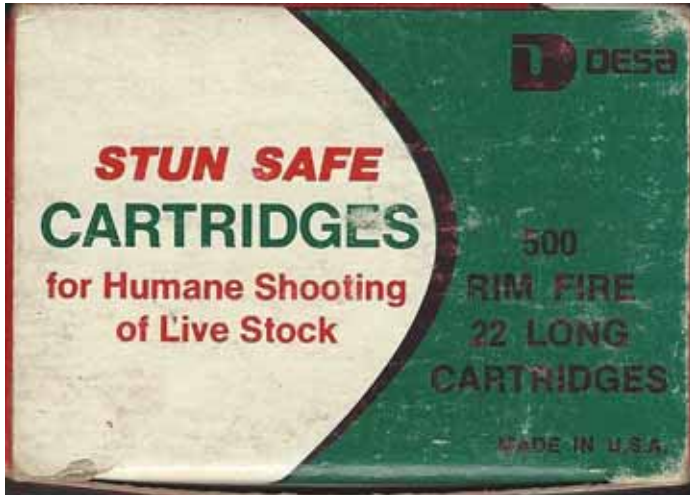
The cartridges were also made in 45 Auto.

It is believed that Desa Industries made these when Remington sold their power tool business to Desa in 1969. There were only about 50 stun guns produced to fire them. The stun gun has a tube holding 10-12 rounds and is fired by pushing the barrel down and squeezing the trigger.

These cartridges can also be used in standard firearm chambered for .22 Long Rifle. The rounds are supposedly hotter than a standard .22 Long.

# HOXIE BULLET

**The Hoxie Bullet**

**T**HE HOXIE bullet is shown in the accompanying cut which shows a longitudinal section through an ordinary rifle cartridge with the Hoxie impact bullet in the outer end of an air filled cavity in the forward part of the bullet proper. The proportion and size and structure of the various parts, of course, are varied to suit different conditions, but the cut illustrates clearly the general principle of the Hoxie invention.

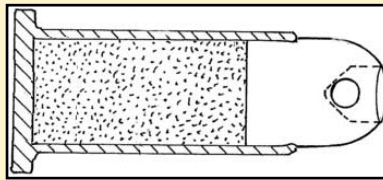

On February 5th, 1907, Gilbert H. Hoxie was awarded U. S. patent # 843,017 which called for the placing of a small steel ball in the nose of standard bullets with the idea that the steel ball would increase penetration. A company was started and the small steel balls were soon being placed in Winchester ammunition. Centerfire ammunition is seen the most with this addition. Only one box of rimfire ammunition has been found.

It is pictured here in Winchester 22 Automatic caliber. The lone surviving round also has the distinctive letter "W" on the case near the mouth.

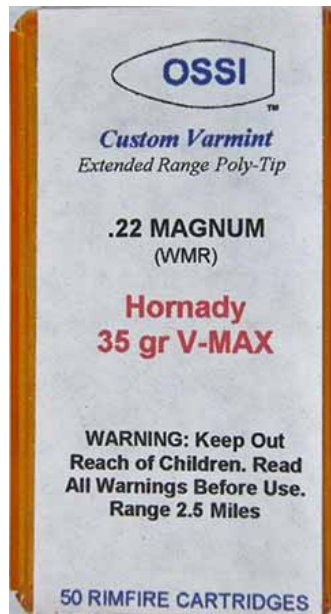

- S-1 .22 SHORT CASELESS CARTRIDGES. "DAISY-"HEDDON". Black box with yellow and black printing. One-piece box with end flaps. White propellant with a lead bullet. While this is not a rimfire it could almost be classed as one.
- S-1.1 .22 SHORT CASELESS CARTRIDGES. "DAISY-"HEDDON". Same as S-1 except with a 5.6 MM sticker on top.

# MISC. MANUFACTURERS & ETC. Over-Labels

Back in the 1800's, retailers often applied over-labels to the tops or the bottoms of cartridge boxes in order to advertise their businesses. This is just a sample of these over labels. This could be a collecting field in itself.

- BB-1 .22 B.B. CAPS. 250 round box. Green label with black printing. Black mottled, two-piece, half-split box. Orange side sealing label. This is a standard U.M.C. box with an over label.
- S-1 .22 SHORT. 50 round box. Buff label with black printing. An over-label on a standard Winchester box.
- L-1 .22 LONG. White over-label with blue printing on bottom of Remington box
- L-2 .22 LONG (HOLLOW POINT). Green over-label with black printing on bottom of Winchester box.
- LR-1 .22 LONG RIFLE. Green over-label with black printing on top of Peters box
- ??-1 .22 UNKNOWN. Dark blue over-label on top of Remington Dogbone box.

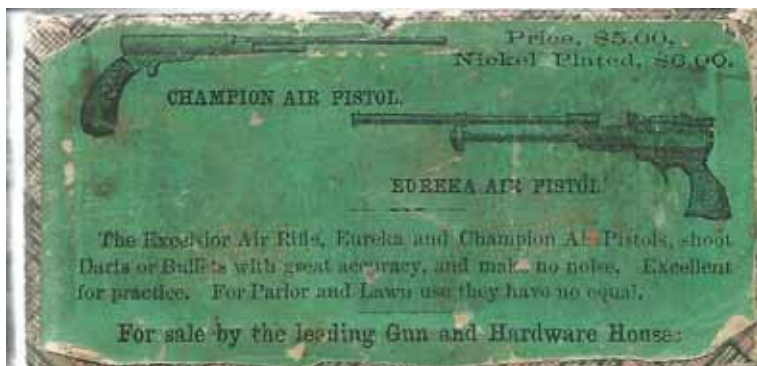
